

Instructions:

Pelican Int'l granite-composite sinks represent beauty and elegance while being durable, sustainable, and safe. Made of 85% pure quartz, the hardest constituent of granite, coupled with a high-grade acrylic binder, Pelican Int'l sinks offer unsurpassed surface hardness along with scratch, chip, and heat resistance up to 535°F. The hygienic, non-porous surface is easy-to-clean, both stain and acid-resistant, and does not absorb odors or bacteria.

Cleaning Guide:

Rinse the sink after each use with warm water and a nonabrasive scrubber pad or nonabrasive cleaner, such as liquid Soft Scrub. Even household baking soda will accomplish the same effect without the chemical additives. Always rinse well so gritty residue is not left in the sink.

******Use of strong chemicals, abrasive powders, and steel wool pads will degrade the surface and make the sink more susceptible to stains******

Always:

- Clean everyday by thoroughly rinsing with a mild soap and warm water.
- Keep the sink free of any standing water as this can cause a buildup of mineral deposits, which can affect the appearance of your sink.
- Remove stubborn spots by gently scrubbing with a mild non-abrasive cleanser such as Soft Scrub.
- Rinse the sink after using any cleaning agent.
- Clean any mineral deposits built up over time with a mild solution of vinegar and water followed by a thorough flushing with water.
- Remove any scratches with a Scotch-Brite pad and cleaning agent.

Never:

- Use any abrasive cleaning agents or scrub pads such as steel wool
- Use straight bleach to clean or remove strains
- Use commercial alkalis such as ammonia and/or caustic solutions
- Use drain blocking chemicals that involve filling the sink with waterdeposits, which can affect the appearance of your sink.
